New Tools & Technologies: Human Health and Ecological Risk Assessment

As new tools and technologies for evaluating and addressing environmental toxicology, risk, and health problems are developed, regulators, researchers and practitioners must determine how to integrate the new tools and technologies into current practices. New tools need to be specific, accurate, and cost effective. Predictions based on new tools must be correlated with established methods for toxicological evaluation and risk prediction. New tools can come with their own risks that need to be understood and characterized.
